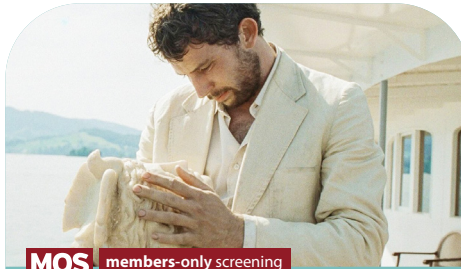
The Ballard of Wallis Island 4 Oct

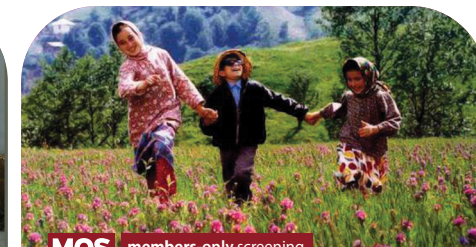
Tinā 15 Nov
